Outline

This intensive workshop is designed for business managers and planners moving to introduce Earned Value Management (EVM) into an organization. Using EVM techniques in a practical business-oriented manner adds significant additional information and power to the organization's project control process. This course outlines the techniques and processes needed to implement EVM in an effective and practical manner.

Target audience, staff and managers implementing, or using EVM as a core component of their organization's project controls function.

Delivery
